<u>Consent Agenda:</u> Director Ryland noted that she would be abstaining from the vote due to her absence in the January meeting. Director Gibson made a motion to approve the items for the consent agenda. The motion was seconded by Director Musso.

<u>Special Presentation</u>: Chief Duerr introduced Field Coordinator, Dane Wadle from the California Special District Association who gave a presentation on the advocacy efforts statewide for covid relief for special districts. He congratulated the District on being awarded \$133,000 in covid relief funding through the CSDA lobbying effort.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Station 18 New Truck Room Update: Staff recommends discussion on the proposed project and progress made to date. Chief Duerr began that the gas and electric are now disconnected from the training house and will be demolished sometime this month. He suggested the District re-appraise the project as the initial expansion costs came in over budget at \$2.6 million. He proposed two concepts for the project: 1) at a minimum to extend the apparatus bay or 2) to keep the footprint for the initial

plans/permits and not complete the first section. The apparatus bay would be extended adding solar panels along with an interior refresh in the living quarters. He continued that solar return on investment would be 7-8 years. The Board asked Chief Duerr to do further research and bring back the item with more information and ideas to the April Board meeting.

<u>Employee Retention</u>: Staff recommends discussion on current issues facing the district involving employee retention. Chief Duerr began that the district has one vacancy at the Apprentice Firefighter level that is currently in backgrounds with two Firefighter Paramedics vacancies. The Captain and Battalion Chief testing are still in process. The new Division Chief will start on February 28<sup>th</sup>. Currently there are no separations, and the District is stable.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

<u>Fiscal Year 2021/22 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Budget Report</u>: Staff recommends a short presentation on the status of the Fiscal Year 2021/22 budget. Chief Duerr presented the financial statements for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of the 2021/22 fiscal year. Revenues are at 55.8% with expenses expected to be directly at 50% but are at 55.4% overall. Salaries and benefits are running high at 53% due to overtime costs while service and operations are also running over at 65.4%. He explained that the District is reviewing all expenditures closely and renegotiating the costs for service contracts throughout the District. Director Gibson made a motion to approve the Fiscal Year 2021/22 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Budget reports as presented. Director Ryland made a second to the motion.

Station 19 Memorial Plaque: Staff requests Board to take action to formally approve the addition of retired Fire Chief Tony Corado to the Station 19 Memorial Plaque. Chief Duerr explained that Station 19 was dedicated as the District's memorial station in August of 2003. It was intended to allow for future names to be added to the plaque for individuals who positively impacted the community while serving the District after their passing. Chief Duerr asked to Board to have Retired Chief Corado's named included on the memorial plaque on behalf of the District employees. Chief Corado was with the District for 33 years serving the community. Director Ryland made a motion to approve the addition of Chief Corado's name to the memorial plaque. Director Gibson made a second to the motion.

<u>Engineer Job Description Amendment</u>: Staff recommends updating the Engineer job description to reflect the State certification changes. Chief Duerr explained that the District is continually monitoring the fire service practice to ensure job requirements meet industry standards. It was found that a discrepancy existed in the position of Engineer for requirements to obtain a certification for CSFM Certified Fire Apparatus Drive/Operator Pump apparatus. Chief Duerr asked the Board for the modification to the job description to increase the qualified candidate pool. Director Gibson made a motion to approve the amendment to the job description for Engineer. Director Ryland made a second to the motion.

SCI Proposal for Providing Consulting, Engineer of Work and Levy Administration on South Placer Fire Districts (Former Loomis Fire Districts) Emergency Response Services Assessment District: Chief recommends discussion and approval for the Chief the execute the new agreement with SCI Consulting. The current agreement for the Fire Protection and Emergency Response Services Assessment District for the former Loomis Fire District areas is expiring at the end of this fiscal year. The final year of the current contract for 2021/22 equaled \$10,922. The proposed costs of the new three-year contract are \$12,250; \$12,585; \$12,935. Director Gibson made a motion to approve Chief Duerr to execute the contract with SCI Consulting Group. Director Ryland made a second to the motion.

NFPA 1582 Compliant District Physicals: Staff recommends a discussion on implementing the national Fire Protection Association 1582 physicals. Chief Duerr explained that the NFPA 1582 provides early detection of underlying medical conditions vis physicals that keep the firefighters safe throughout their careers. The District would like to provide these physicals on a regular basis that ensure the health and wellbeing of our members while performing their job tasks. Labor and management have worked together to implement a program that will protect our most valuable assets, our personnel, through a comprehensive mental health and wellness program. The Districts workers compensation carrier, FASIS, offsets the costs of these physicals by 75% every three years. The costs to provide NFPA physicals is \$14300 including the offset by FASIS. For the District to provide the minimum requirements under the law would be \$9200, not including the in-depth job special evaluations of the NFPA 1582 physical. Proceeding with the full exams will cost the District an additional \$5100. Chief Duerr continued that these costs are not currently accounted for in the budget. Director Johnson noted that he was a proponent and would like to work with labor to develop a policy. Chief Duerr agreed to bring the item back next month for further discussion and action.

## INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION

Covid-19 Update: Chief recommends updating the Board on the status of the current pandemic and the district's response and preparations. Chief noted that current cases are at 58,030 with a 7-day positive rate of 21.3%. He noted that the Governor is looking to reinstate the supplemental sick leave which is unfunded costs to the District. Chief Duerr continued that he is optimistic for an endemic soon and would like next month to be the final covid update

**Background:** The South Placer Fire District has experienced vacancies at every rank for many reasons, including competition with other agencies, retirements, and competitive wages. The District continues to recruit, test, and hire personnel

- **Apprentice** Vacancy has been filled by Apprentice Greg Warren, who will begin March 7<sup>th</sup>.
- **Firefighter** Two (2) vacant positions. We are working with a vendor to establish a new hiring list with a projected timeline of two to three months to establish a list.
- **Engineer** No vacancies at this time with one candidate on the existing list.
- Captain One (1) vacancy. The written test was held on February 25<sup>th</sup>, with seven (7) internal members taking the test. (Results were not available at the time of publication of this memo). The assessment center is tentatively scheduled for the week of March 28<sup>th</sup>.
- **Battalion Chief** One (1) vacancy. Written test was conducted with three (3) of the nine (9) taking the written test passing. The Assessment center was held on March 3<sup>rd</sup>, and we are awaiting results.
- **Division Chief of EMS/Safety** position is filled by Chief Magnuson, who started February 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Impact:** Increased awareness of retention issues at all ranks.

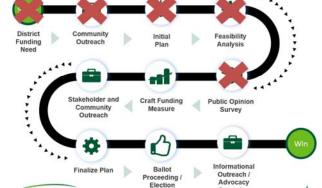

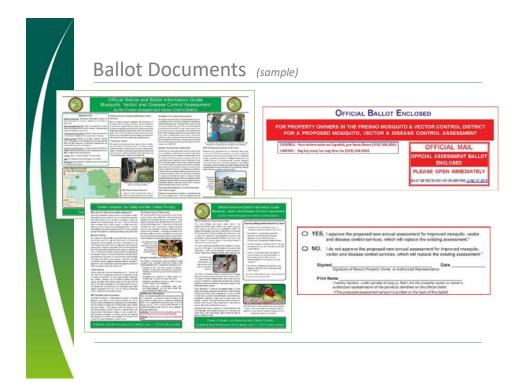

## Agenda Item: Motor Vehicle Accident Cost Recovery Fee Adjustment:

**Action Requested:** Chief recommends a short review, discussion and action on the Motor Vehicle Accident Cost Recovery services agreement.

**Background:** In 2009, the Board adopted an ordinance allowing for cost recovery from vehicle accidents to offset the increasing cost of service within the District. The program allows the District to recover costs incurred by rendering rescue services at auto accidents by billing the responsible party (does not include ambulance transport fees). The program is generally set up to bill non-resident insurance companies when a responsible party is identified. The service agreement with Fire Receovery USA, LLC. has not been renewed in many years. Staff requests the Board to approve a revised agreement, including fee adjustments, by authorizing the Fire Chief to enter into a renewed agreement.

**Impact:** Renewed agreement will allow for ongoing cost recovery

### SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Services Agreement ("Agreement") is made effective as of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2022 ("Effective Date"), by and between **FIRE RECOVERY USA**, **LLC**, a California limited liability company ("Company"), and **South Placer Fire District**, ("Client"). The Company and Client are referred to herein individually as a "party" and collectively as the "parties."

## RECITALS

WHEREAS, Company engages in the business of performing billing services ("Company Services") for United States Fire Departments in connection with the motor vehicle incidents and other emergency incidents at which the Client provides emergency services: and

WHEREAS, Client seeks the services of Company to assist with the billing for services that Client provides in connection with motor vehicle incidents and other emergency incidents; and

WHEREAS, Company and Client desire to enter into this Agreement to memorialize their agreements regarding the Company Services to be provided to Client.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual representations, warranties and covenants set forth herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Company and Client agree as follows:

# ARTICLE 1 ENGAGEMENT

1.1. <u>Engagement</u>: Client hereby engages Company to provide the Company Services described in Article 4 herein, and Client hereby accepts such engagement, all on the terms and conditions set forth herein. Company will determine the method, detail and means of performing the services detailed below.

# ARTICLE 2 REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

- 2.1. Representations and Warranties of Company: Company hereby represents and warrants to Client that, at all times during the term of this Agreement, Company is a limited liability company duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the State of California.
- 2.2. Representations and Warranties of Client: Client hereby represents and warrants to Company that, at all times during the term of this Agreement, Client is, or Governs, or Contracts with an organized fire department established pursuant to the laws and ordinances of the state in which Client is located.

# ARTICLE 3 COMPANY STATUS AND QUALIFICATIONS

- 3.1. <u>Independent Contractor</u>: Company enters into this Agreement, and will remain throughout the term of the Agreement, as an independent contractor. Company agrees that it will not become an employee, partner, agent or principal of Client while this Agreement is in effect.
- 3.2. <u>Payment of Income Taxes</u>: Company is responsible for paying when due all income taxes, including estimated taxes, incurred as a result of the compensation paid by Client to Company for services rendered under this Agreement. On request, Company will provide Client with proof of timely payment. Company agrees to indemnify Client for any claims, costs, losses, fees, penalties, interest, or damages suffered by Client resulting from Company's failure to comply with this provision.
- 3.3. <u>Use of Employees or Subcontractors</u>: Company may, at Company's own expense, use any employees or subcontractors as Company deems necessary to perform the services required of Company by this Agreement. Client may not control, direct, or supervise Company's employees or subcontractors in the performance of those services.
- 3.4. <u>Qualifications</u>: Company represents that it is qualified and has the skills necessary to perform the services under this Agreement in a competent and professional manner, without the advice or direction of Client.
  - 3.5. Ownership Interest: Company will have no ownership interest in Client.
- 3.6. <u>No Benefit Contributions</u>: Company shall have no obligation under this Agreement to compensate or pay applicable taxes or provide employee benefits of any kind to any person employed or retained by Client.
- 3.7. <u>Attorney-in-Fact</u>: Client appoints Company as Client's attorney-in-fact for the following purposes:
  - (a) <u>Billing and Collections</u>: To bill and collect ("Collections") all revenue earned by and due to Client, in connection with Client's provision of emergency services provided/rendered at the sites of motor vehicle incidents and other emergency incidents, and to receive all Collections on Client's behalf and to sue for and give satisfaction for monies due on account and to withdraw any claims, suits, or proceedings pertaining to or arising out of Company's or Client's right to collect such amounts; and
  - (b) <u>Endorsement</u>: To take possession of and endorse in Client's name any notes, checks, money orders, and any other instruments received as Collections.

# ARTICLE 4 GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF COMPANY

4.1. <u>Minimum Amount of Service</u>: Company agrees to devote as much time and attention to the performance of the Company Services under this Agreement as may be, in Company's sole discretion, required to accomplish the tasks described herein to accomplish the results for which the Company is responsible under this Agreement.

- 4.2. <u>Company Services</u>: Company agrees to perform the Company Services as set forth in the "List of Company Services" attached hereto as Schedule "A" and incorporated herein by reference; including those additional services requested by Client and accepted in writing by the Company during the term of this Agreement.
- 4.3. <u>Non-Exclusive Relationship</u>: Company may represent, perform services for, and contract with as many additional clients, persons, or companies as Company, in Company's sole discretion, sees fit.
- 4.4. <u>Time and Place of Performing Work</u>: Company may perform the services under this Agreement at any suitable time and location Company chooses.
- 4.5. <u>Materials and Equipment</u>: Company will supply all materials and equipment required to perform the services under this Agreement.
- 4.6. <u>Workers' Compensation</u>: Company agrees to provide workers' compensation insurance for Company and Company's employees and agents and agrees to hold harmless and indemnify Client for any and all claims arising out of any injury, disability, or death of any of Company's employees or agents.
- 4.7. <u>Assignment</u>: Neither this Agreement nor any duties or obligations under this Agreement may be assigned by Company without the prior written consent of Client, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

# ARTICLE 5 COMPENSATION OF COMPANY

- 5.1. <u>Compensation for Company Services</u>: All Company Services provided pursuant to this Agreement will be provided in accordance with the terms, including compensation amounts and schedule of remittance, set forth in the "List of Company Services," attached hereto as Schedule A.
- 5.2. The provisions of Article 11 of this Agreement will govern any dispute associated with compensation.

# ARTICLE 6 OBLIGATIONS OF CLIENT

6.1. <u>Cooperation of Client</u>: The Client agrees to comply with all reasonable requests of Company and provide access to all documents reasonably necessary to the performance of Company's duties under this Agreement. The Client shall be responsible for initially insuring, and continuing to review, local and state laws in the Client's jurisdiction to assure adequate legal authority for Company to engage in the Services described herein on behalf of Client.

6.2. Assignment: Once a run is assigned to Company for processing, Company will pursue collection until all efforts have been exhausted. While Company is pursuing payment on a claim Client is precluded from assigning any duties or obligations under this Agreement to any other party, without the written consent of Company. Client may not negotiate a settlement of a run Company is processing without Company's written consent to the terms of the settlement and compensation due to Company for processing the run. Once Company has determined a run is not collectible it will either be archived and closed or sent to a collection agency (only if Client chooses to do so). Sending an account to collection incurs additional fees to Client. If payment is received from a collection agency, the amount received will be posted to Client's account by Company. Company will reimburse Client at the rate set forth in Schedule A, List of Company Services for that particular run, minus any additional fees from the collection agency.

# ARTICLE 7 CLIENT AUTHORIZATION

- 7.1. <u>Authorization</u>: Notwithstanding other provisions of this Agreement, Company shall obtain authorization from Client prior to performing any of the following:
  - (a) The sale conveyance, transfer, pledge exchange, assignment, hypothecation, or encumbrance of Client's interest in any sums owed to Client; and
  - (b) All other limitations as stated by the terms of this Agreement.

# ARTICLE 8 TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- 8.1. <u>Termination on Notice</u>: Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving thirty days (30) written notice to the other party. Unless earlier terminated as set forth below, this Agreement shall be effective as of the date first set out above and shall continue for a period of one (1) year thereafter. This Agreement shall automatically renew for successive one (1) year periods, unless either party provides written notification to the other party of its decision not to renew this Agreement. Any runs submitted for processing to Company prior to the date of the notice of termination will continue to be processed under the terms of the List of Company Services set forth in this Agreement.
- 8.2. <u>Termination on Occurrence of Stated Events</u>: This Agreement will terminate automatically on the occurrence of any of the following events;
  - (a) Bankruptcy or insolvency of either party;
  - (b) The assignment of this Agreement by either party without the consent of the other party; the parties agree that neither party will unreasonably withhold consent to such an assignment.
- 8.3. <u>Termination for Default</u>: If either party defaults in the performance of this Agreement or materially breaches any of its provisions, the non-breaching party may terminate this Agreement by giving written notification to the breaching party. Termination will take effect immediately on receipt of notice by the breaching party or five days (5) after mailing of notice,

whichever occurs first. For the purposes of this paragraph, material breach of this Agreement includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- (a) Company's failure to complete the services specified in the Description of Services;
- (b) Client's material breach of any representation, warranty or agreement contained in this Agreement;
- (c) Company's material breach of any representation, warranty or agreement contained in this Agreement;
- (d) If Fire Department does not maintain a minimum of 6 billable runs in a given year, they will be terminated unless they exercise a service fee of \$250 to extend the agreement for another year.

## ARTICLE 9 PROPRIETARY RIGHTS

- 9.1. <u>Confidential Information</u>: Any written, printed, graphic, or electronically or magnetically recorded information furnished by Client for Company's use are the sole property of Client. This proprietary information includes, but is not limited to, customer requirements, customer lists, marketing information, and information concerning the Client's employees, products, services, prices, operations, and subsidiaries. Company will keep this confidential information in the strictest confidence, and will not disclose it by any means to any person except with the Client's approval, and only to the extent necessary to perform the services under this Agreement. This prohibition also applies to Company's employees, agents, and subcontractors. On termination of this Agreement, Company will return any confidential information in Company's possession to Client.
- 9.2 <u>Confidential Information</u>: Any written, printed, graphic, electronically or magnetically recorded information, computer-based hardware, software, applications, software scripts, or software links furnished by Company for Client's use are the sole property of Company. This proprietary information includes, but is not limited to, customer requirements, customer lists, marketing information, and information concerning the Company's employees, products, services, prices, operations, and subsidiaries. Client will keep this confidential information in the strictest confidence, and will not disclose it by any means to any person except with the Company's approval, and only to the extent necessary to perform the services under this Agreement. This prohibition also applies to Client's employees, agents, and subcontractors. On termination of this Agreement, Client will return any confidential information in Client's possession to Company.

# ARTICLE 10 INDEMNIFICATION

10.1. <u>Indemnification</u>: To the extent permitted by applicable law, the Company will indemnify and hold the Client harmless from and against any and all loss, damage, liability, claims and/or injury resulting from all negligent actions performed by the Company, or its agents on the

Company's behalf, in connection with this Agreement. However, this indemnification shall not apply with respect to any legal cause, action or consequential liability or losses as a result from inaccurate or incomplete information or unfounded or unreasonable submissions furnished to the Company by the Client nor shall it apply to any act, omission or negligence of the Client.

# ARTICLE 11 GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 11.1. <u>Governing Law</u>: This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of California, without giving effect to any choice or conflict of law provision or rule (whether of the State of California or any other jurisdiction that would cause the application of the laws of any jurisdiction other that the State of California).
- 11.2. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties pertaining to the subject matter contained in it and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations, and understanding of the parties.
- 11.3. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>: Except as otherwise provided herein, the provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, the successors, assigns, heirs, executors and administrators of the parties hereto. No party may assign any of its rights or obligations hereunder without the express written consent of the other party hereto, which consent may not be unreasonably withheld; provided, however, any party may assign any and all of its rights and interests hereunder to one or more of its affiliates and designate one or more of its affiliates to perform its obligations hereunder; provided, however, that such party remains liable for full and total performance of its obligations hereunder.
- 11.4. <u>Notices</u>: Any notices authorized to be given hereunder shall be in writing and deemed given, if delivered personally or by overnight courier, on the date of delivery, if a Business Day, or if not a business day, on the first Business Day following delivery, or if mailed, three days after mailing by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, and in each case, addressed, as follows:

foregoing notice provisions. When used in this Agreement, the term "Business Day" shall mean a day other than a Saturday, Sunday or a Federal Holiday.

- 11.5. <u>Waiver; Amendments</u>: This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement of the parties respecting the subject matter hereof, (ii) supersede any prior and contemporaneous understandings, agreements, or representations by or among the parties, written or oral, to the extent they related in any way to the subject matter hereof, and (iii) may not be amended orally, and no right or obligation of any party may be altered, except as expressly set forth in a writing signed by such party.
  - 11.6. <u>Counterparts</u>: This Agreement may be signed in several counterparts.
- 11.7. <u>Expenses</u>: Each party shall bear its own expenses incurred with respect to the preparation of this Agreement and the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby.

## 11.8. Arbitration:

- (a) If at any time there shall be a dispute arising out of or relating to any provision of this Agreement, any Transaction Document or any agreement contemplated hereby or thereby, such dispute shall be submitted for binding and final determination by arbitration in accordance with the regulations then obtaining of the American Arbitration Association. Judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator(s) resulting from such arbitration shall be in writing, and shall be final and binding upon all involved parties. The site of any arbitration shall be at a site agreed to by the parties and the arbitration decision can be enforced in a "court of competent jurisdiction".
- (b) This arbitration clause shall survive the termination of this Agreement, any Transaction Document and any agreement contemplated hereby or thereby.
- 11.9. <u>Waiver of Jury Trial; Exemplary Damages</u>: THE PARTIES HERETO HEREBY WAIVE THEIR RIGHTS TO TRIAL BY JURY WITH RESPECT TO ANY DISPUTE ARISING UNDER THIS AGREEMENT OR ANY TRANSACTION DOCUMENT. NO PARTY SHALL BE AWARDED PUNITIVE OR OTHER EXEMPLARY DAMAGES RESPECTING ANY DISPUTE ARISING UNDER THIS AGREEMENT OR ANY TRANSACTION DOCUMENT CONTEMPLATED HEREBY.
- 11.10 <u>Cooperative Purchases</u>: This Agreement may be used by other government agencies. Company has agreed to offer similar serves to other agencies under the same or similar terms and conditions as stated herein except that the revenue share percentage (Compensation) may be negotiated between the Company and other agencies based on the specific revenue expectations, agency reimbursed costs, and other agency requirements. The City/County/or Client/Protection District will in no way whatsoever incur any liability in relation to specifications, delivery, payment, or any other aspect of purchase by other agencies.

# SCHEDULE A

# LIST OF COMPANY SERVICES

- 1. Company agrees to bill the responsible party on the Client's behalf for services provided/rendered during motor vehicle incidents and other emergency incidents. The Mitigation Rates lists in Exhibit A will increase by 5.9% annually or based on the annual percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI), as developed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor, whichever is more. Rate adjustments will occur on the anniversary date of this ordinance/resolution to keep the fire department's cost recovery program in conformity with increasing operating expenses.
- 2. Company will provide, as a normal matter of business; entry of claims and submission to the responsible party, collections of monies deemed due to the Client, payments of the agreed upon percentage of said monies to Client, and reporting of progress.
- 3. Company agrees to bill to the best of its ability all claims provided to Company by the Client.
- 4. Company will not begin litigation against a person, entity, or insurance carrier without prior written approval by the Client.
- 5. Company agrees to reimburse Client a portion of the monies collected at a rate of 78% (seventy-eight percent) of the total monies collected on the Client's claims. Total monies collected will be net, after any credit card processing fees (charged at 4%) or any collection agency fees. If Client submits a claim to Company and later wants to cancel the claim, Client may be subject to a billing fee. If Client agrees to submit a claim to Company's collection agency and later wants to remove it from collection status, Client may be subject to a fee of up to 35% of the amount of the claim to compensate for efforts made to collect the claim.
- 6. Company agrees to pay these monies collected to the Client on a monthly basis, within seven (7) working days after the close and accounting of the monthly billing cycle.
- 7. Company agrees to make available reports via a password protected website to the Client which detail billable claims outstanding (which are claims submitted, but not yet completed) and claims completed in the prior billing cycle.
- 8. Company will not be responsible for, nor accept any liability for, any erroneous, invalid, or illegal procedure codes or claims submitted to Company by the Client on the Run Sheets.

# **EXHIBIT A**

# **MITIGATION RATES**

# **BASED ON PER HOUR**

The mitigation rates below are average "billing levels", and are typical for the incident responses listed, however, when a claim is submitted, it may be itemized and based on the actual services provided.

These rates are based on actual costs using amortized schedules for apparatus (including useful life, equipment, repairs, and maintenance). Labor rates include an average department's actual burdened labor costs and not just a firefighter's wage. These include wages, retirement, benefits, workers comp, etc.

# **MOTOR VEHICLE INCIDENTS**

## Level 1 - \$546.00

Provide hazardous materials assessment and scene stabilization. This will be the most common "billing level". This occurs almost every time the fire department responds to an accident/incident.

# Level 2 - \$623.00

Includes Level 1 services as well as clean up and material used (sorbents) for hazardous fluid clean up and disposal. We will bill at this level if the fire department has to clean up any gasoline or other automotive fluids that are spilled as a result of the accident/incident.

# Level 3 - CAR FIRE - \$760.00

Provide scene safety, fire suppression, breathing air, rescue tools, hand tools, hose, tip use, foam, structure protection, and clean up gasoline or other automotive fluids that are spilled as a result of the accident/incident.

# **ADD-ON SERVICES:**

# **Extrication - \$1,641.00**

Includes heavy rescue tools, ropes, airbags, cribbing etc. This charge will be added if the fire department has to free/remove anyone from the vehicle(s) using any equipment. We will not bill at this level if the patient is simply unconscious and fire department is able to open the door to access the patient. This level is to be billed only if equipment is deployed.

# **Creating a Landing Zone - \$502.00**

Includes Air Care (multi-engine company response, mutual aid, helicopter). We will bill at this level any time a helicopter landing zone is created and/or is utilized to transport the patient(s).

**Itemized Response:** You have the option to bill each incident as an independent event with custom mitigation rates, for each incident using, itemized rates deemed usual, customary and reasonable (UCR). These incidents will be billed, itemized per apparatus, per personnel, plus products and equipment used.

# **HAZMAT**

# Level 1 - \$881.00

**Basic Response:** Claim will include engine response, first responder assignment, perimeter establishment, evacuations, set-up and command.

# Level 2 - \$3,146.00

**Intermediate Response:** Claim will include engine response, first responder assignment, hazmat certified team and appropriate equipment, perimeter establishment, evacuations, set-up and command, Level A or B suit donning, breathing air and detection equipment. Set-up and removal of decon center.

# Level 3 - \$7,426.00

**Advanced Response:** Claim will include engine response, first responder assignment, hazmat certified team and appropriate equipment, perimeter establishment, evacuations, first responder set-up and command, Level A or B suit donning, breathing air and detection equipment and robot deployment. Set-up and removal of decon center, detection equipment, recovery and identification of material. Disposal and environment clean up. Includes above in addition to any disposal rates of material and contaminated equipment and material used at scene. Includes 3 hours of on scene time - **each additional hour @ \$356.00 per HAZMAT team**.

# FIRE INVESTIGATION

Fire Investigation Team - \$346.00 per hour.

# Includes:

- Scene Safety
- Investigation
- Source Identification
- K-9/Arson Dog Unit
- Identification Equipment
- Mobile Detection Unit
- Fire Report

The claim begins when the Fire Investigator responds to the incident and is billed for logged time only.

### FIRES

Assignment - \$503.00 per hour, per engine / \$629.00 per hour, per truck

# Includes:

- Scene Safety
- Investigation
- Fire / Hazard Control

This will be the most common "billing level". This occurs almost every time the fire department responds to an incident.

OPTIONAL: A fire department has the option to bill each fire as an independent event with custom mitigation rates.

Itemized, per person, at various pay levels and for itemized products use.

# **ILLEGAL FIRES**

# Assignment - \$503.00 per hour, per engine / \$629.00 per hour, per truck

When a fire is started by any person or persons that requires a fire department response during a time or season when fires are regulated or controlled by local or state rules, provisions or ordinances because of pollution or fire danger concerns, such person or persons will be liable for the fire department response at a cost not to exceed the actual expenses incurred by the fire department to respond and contain the fire. Similarly, if a fire is started where permits are required for such a fire and the permit was not obtained and the fire department is required to respond to contain the fire the responsible party will be liable for the response at a cost not to exceed the actual expenses incurred by the fire department. The actual expenses will include direct labor, equipment costs and any other costs that can be reasonably allocated to the cost of the response.

# WATER INCIDENTS

## Level 1

**Basic Response:** Claim will include engine response, first responder assignment, perimeter establishment, evacuations, first responder set-up and command, scene safety and investigation (including possible patient contact, hazard control). This will be the most common "billing level". This occurs almost every time the fire department responds to a water incident.

Billed at \$503 plus \$62 per hour, per rescue person.

# Level 2

**Intermediate Response:** Includes Level 1 services as well as clean up and material used (sorbents), minor hazardous clean up and disposal. We will bill at this level if the fire department has to clean up small amounts of gasoline or other fluids that are spilled as a result of the incident.

Billed at \$1,006 plus \$62 per hour, per rescue person.

# Level 3

**Advanced Response:** Includes Level 1 and Level 2 services as well as D.A.R.T. activation, donning breathing apparatus and detection equipment. Set up and removal of decon center, detection equipment, recovery and identification of material. Disposal and environment clean up. Includes above in addition to any disposal rates of material and contaminated equipment and material used at scene.

Billed at \$2,489 plus \$62 per hour per rescue person, plus \$126 per hour per HAZMAT team member.

# Level 4

**Itemized Response:** You have the option to bill each incident as an independent event with custom mitigation rates for each incident using itemized rates deemed usual, customary and reasonable (UCR). These incidents will be billed, itemized, per trained rescue person, plus rescue products used.

# **BACK COUNTRY OR SPECIAL RESCUE**

**Itemized Response:** Each incident will be billed with custom mitigation rates deemed usual, customary and reasonable (UCR). These incidents will be billed, itemized per apparatus per hour, per trained rescue person per hour, plus rescue products used.

Minimum billed \$503 for the first response vehicle plus \$62 per rescue person. Additional rates of \$503 per hour per response vehicle and \$62 per hour per rescue person.

# CHIEF RESPONSE

This includes the set-up of Command, and providing direction of the incident. This could include operations, safety, and administration of the incident.

Billed at \$315 per hour.

# MISCELLANEOUS / ADDITIONAL TIME ON-SCENE

# **ADDITIONAL TIME ON-SCENE** (for all levels of service)

Engine billed at \$503 per hour. Truck billed at \$629 per hour. Miscellaneous equipment billed at \$378.

# **MITIGATION RATE NOTES**

The mitigation rates above are average "billing levels" for one hour of service, and are typical for the incident responses listed, however, when a claim is submitted, it may be itemized and based on the actual services provided.

These average mitigation rates were determined by itemizing costs for a typical run (from the time a fire apparatus leaves the station until it returns to the station) and are based on the actual costs, using amortized schedules for apparatus (including useful life, equipment, repairs, and maintenance) and labor rates (an average department's "actual personnel expense" and not just a firefighter's basic wage). The actual personnel expense includes costs such as wages, retirement, benefits, workers comp, insurance, etc.

# ORIDINANCE 3-2008/2010

# AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AND IMPLEMENTING A PROGRAM TO CHARGE USER FEES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES RENDERED BY THE SOUTH PLACER FIRE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, additional demands are placed on all operational aspects of the Fire District by the increasing needs for Emergency Services response activity to incidents on the highways; and

WHEREAS, the Fire District has investigated different methods to maintain a high level of quality of emergency service capability through times of consistently increasing service demands, where maintaining an effective response by the Fire District decreases the cost of incidents to insurance carriers through timely and effective management of emergency situations, saving lives and reducing property damage; and

WHEREAS, rising real property tax to meet the increase in service demands would not be fair to the property owners, when a high percentage of Motor Vehicle Accidents (MVA) involve individuals not owning property or paying taxes in the jurisdiction; and the ability of Fire District to effectively respond decreases the liability of insurance companies by saving lives and minimizing damage; and

WHEREAS, the South Placer Fire District desires to implement a fair and equitable procedure by which to collect said MVA fees and establish a billing system in accordance with applicable laws, regulations and guidelines; Now, Therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SOUTH PLACER FIRE DISTRICT:

# SECTION 1: Motor Vehicle Accident Cost Recovery

- a. The South Placer Fire Protection District shall initiate user fees for the delivery of Fire and Rescue Services, personnel, supplies and equipment to the scene of motor vehicle accidents and other incidents within the District. The rate of user fees shall be that which is usual, customary and reasonable (UCR), which may include any services, personnel, supplies, and equipment and with baseline established by the Board of Directors. These user fees will only apply to persons not residing within the South Placer Fire Protection District. Responses involving intoxicated drivers would be subject to all applicable fees regardless of residency.
- b. The fee shall be billed to the motor vehicle insurance carrier for all vehicles involved in the motor vehicle accident or incident, representing an add-on cost of the claim for damages of the vehicles, property and/ or injuries.
- c. All amounts collected as a result of the Ordinance shall be place into the District General Fund and may be used for any lawful purpose.
- SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall be effective at the expiration of thirty (30) days from the date of adoption.
- SECTION 3: If any section or provision of this Ordinance is declared by the courts to be invalid, such decision shall not invalidate any other sections or provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board of Directors concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in open meetings of this Board of Directors, and that all deliberations of this Board of Directors and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in accordance with all legal requirements, and the Codified Ordinance of Board of Directors.

# Agenda Item: 2022/23 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Fee Adjustment:

**Action Requested:** Chief recommends revising fees and charges for certain EMS services.

**Background:** During the 2006 EMS rate adjustment, the Board requested that the costs and fees associated with the ambulance transporting service be reviewed and presented to the Board each year. At the April 2018 Board meeting, the Chief requested that the fee adjustment in part be tied to a CPI as other Fire Districts have done. The Board passed through ordinance the rate adjustment by the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) Series Title Medical Care in the U.S. City Average, All Urban Consumers, Not Seasonally Adjusted, as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics for the twelve months ending December 31 of the preceding calendar year.

Due to an oversight last fiscal year, no adjustment was taken. With approval from the board, this adjustment will be a two-year compounded rate adjustment of 5.3% (2020 = 2.8%, 2021 = 2.5%).

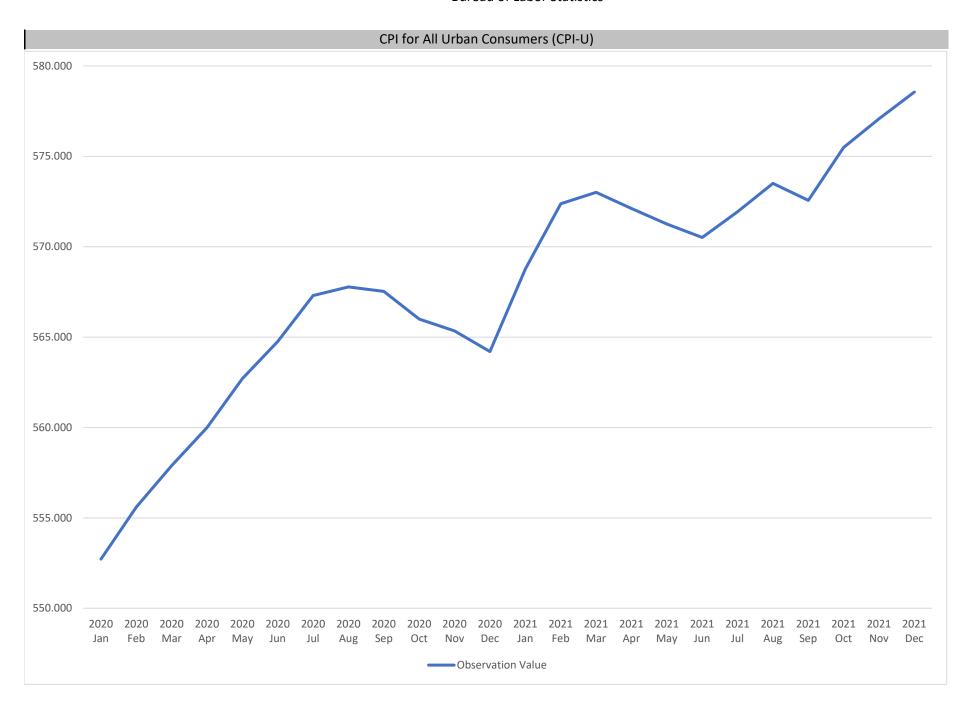

# ORDINANCE NO. 2-2019/20

# ORDINANCE OF THE SOUTH PLACER FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT REVISING THE DISTRICT'S SCHEDULE OF FEES AND CHARGES FOR CERTAIN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

# THE SOUTH PLACER FIRE DISTRICT ORDAINS:

WHEREAS, THE SOUTH PLACER FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT is a fire protection district duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, including California Fire Protection District Law of 1997 (California Health and Safety Code Sections 13800 and following), and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said Health and Safety Code, the District provides various fire protection services, emergency medical services, ambulance transporting services and related activities; and

WHEREAS, there was previously established in 2002 a schedule of fees and charges for the above referenced services, among others, with said schedule of fees and charges has been followed and imposed thereafter by this district, and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code Section 13916 now authorizes the District to charge a fee to cover the costs of any of the services provided by the District, and

WHEREAS, in 2006 the Board of Directors requested these schedules of fees and charges for the above referenced services be reviewed each year, and

WHEREAS, the District has undertaken and completed a current analysis of the cost and expenses incurred and necessary to provide, carry on, conduct and perform the above referenced services and related activities and has found that the revenues pursuant to the existing schedule are not sufficient to meet such costs and expenses and that it is necessary to revise the schedule of such fees and charges – accordingly and increase the same so as to generate sufficient revenue to meet the costs reasonably necessary and estimated to be incurred by the District in providing such services;

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has determined that the fees and charges as revised hereunder are regulatory in nature and not property-related fees and charges as referred to in California Constitution Sections XIIIc and XIIId (former Proposition 218),

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF SOUTH PLACER FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, ORDAIN as follows:

# SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms shall have the following respective meanings unless the context indicates otherwise.

DISTRICT - shall mean South Placer Fire Protection District.

BOARD – shall mean the Board of Directors of this District.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES DIVISION – shall mean and comprise those individuals duly appointed from time to time by the Board and constituting the EMS Division of this District.

MEDICAL AID AND AMBULANCE TRANSPORTING SERVICE FEES – shall mean the schedule of fees and charges established hereunder by this ordinance for the various respective services and related activities referred to in said schedule as approved and any revisions to the schedule found within Exhibit #1.

## SECTION 2. GENERAL POLICIES

LEGISLATIVE INTENT AND FINDING. The Board of Directors deems it necessary and in the best interests of the District in the providing as emergency medical services and activities that various charges and fees are instrumental in providing such services. That a current analysis of the costs and expenses being incurred by the District, providing such services has indicated, that the current schedule of fees and charges for such services and the revenue generated hereunder is inadequate to meet the costs necessarily incurred by the District in order to provide such service and conduct such activities and that pursuant to the foregoing, therefore, it is necessary that the schedule of fees are sufficient hereunder and be revised accordingly and in an amount sufficient to generate revenues to meet the estimated financial needs of the District providing such services and performing such activities. All fees and charges hereunder shall be assessed if patient is transported or services are rendered on scene and patient is released against medical advice. All fees for specified services and activities, the subject of the schedule shall be calculated by the EMS DIVISION OF THE DISTRICT.

# SECTION 3. REVISED SCHEDULE OF FEES AND CHARGES ESTABLISHED

Pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this ORDINANCE, the BOARD OF DIRECTORS does hereby establish the Revised Schedule of Fees and Charges as more particularly shown in Exhibit "#1" attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

# SECTION 4. FEE ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT

The fees identified in the Exhibit #1 shall be adjusted annually, beginning July 1, 2019 and each July 1<sup>st</sup> thereafter, by the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) Series Title Medical Care in the U.S. City Average, All Urban Consumers, Not Seasonally Adjusted, as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics for the twelve month period ending December 31 of the preceding calendar year.

# SECTION 5. REVISION OF FEE SCHEDULE

The Board of Directors of the South Placer Fire District may, from time to time, revise the schedule found in Exhibit #1 as a result of changes in operating expenses of the District outside of Section 4 Annual Fee Adjustment. Such revisions shall be adopted in the form of amendments to this ordinance, after public comment at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board in accordance with Health and Safety Code Section 13916.

# SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence clause of this Ordinance or any part is for any reason held to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or any part thereof.

# SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance, including the revised schedule of fees and charges established hereunder shall become effective no sooner than 30 days after its enactment and within 15 days thereafter shall be posted and published within the District as required by law.

The rates and charges established pursuant to this shall become applicable within the current fiscal year commencing **July 10**<sup>th</sup>, **2020** and remain in effect thereafter.

# **SECTION 8. REVISIONS AND REVOCATIONS**

There is reserved to this Board of Directors the right in their discretion at any time and from time to time to amend, modify or revoke in whole or in part any part, portion or provision of this ordinance as may be permitted or provided by law.

The provisions and revised schedule of fees and charges shall supersede prior ordinances and serve as the current ordinance until such time as the South Placer Fire District Board of Directors adopt an up-dated ordinance relating to said matters.

# **Agenda Item:** Covid-19 Update:

**Action Requested**: Chief recommends updating the Board on the status of the current pandemic and the District's response and preparations.

**Background**: The pandemic is still ongoing. Countywide numbers as of Tuesday 3/1/2022 @ 1200:

The State reinstated Supplemental Paid Sick Leave (SPSL) on February 19, 2022, which reintroduced a mandatory, unfunded liability on the District, requiring paid leave for any member that experiences COVID-19 systems for themselves or their family members. The new SPSL is a two-tier system that grants one-week equivalent (40 hours for admin or 56 hours for suppression personnel) leave for any employee unable to work for the following reasons:

- Vaccine-Related: The covered employee is attending a vaccine or booster appointment for themselves or a family member\* or cannot work or telework because they have vaccinerelated symptoms or are caring for a family member with vaccine-related symptoms. An employer may limit an employee to 24 hours or three days of leave for each vaccination or booster appointment and any consequent side effects unless a health care provider verifies that more recovery time is needed.
- Caring for Yourself: The employee is subject to quarantine or isolation period related to COVID-19 as defined by an order or guidance of the California Department of Public Health, the federal centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or a local public health officer with jurisdiction over the workplace; has been advised by a healthcare provider to quarantine; or is experiencingCOVID-19 symptoms and seeking a medical diagnosis.

• Caring for a Family Member\*: The covered employee is caring for a family member who is subject to a COVID-19 quarantine or isolation period or has been advised by a healthcare provider to quarantine due to COVID-19, or is caring for a child whose school or place of care is closed or unavailable due to COVID-19 on the premises.

Any full-time member can take an additional week of leave for:

- The covered employee tests positive for COVID-19
- The covered employee is caring for a family member\* who tested positive for COVID-19.

\*A family member includes a child, parent, spouse, registered domestic partner, grandparent, grandchild, or sibling.

This program is retroactive to January 1, 2022. It extends until September 30, 2022, and we are working with the membership to make all members whole who experienced leave due to the SPSL mandate.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH), in conjunction with CDC, updated their mask guidance on March 1 to include:

- Effective March 1, 2022, the requirement that unvaccinated individuals mask in indoor public settings will move to a strong recommendation that all persons, regardless of vaccine status, continue indoor masking.
- Universal masking shall remain required in specified high-risk settings.
- Any member working under the Aerosol Transmissible Disease Policy will follow those requirements at all times.

In light of these recommendations and the dramatic decrease in COVID 19-cases in Placer county, the District relaxed its mask mandate. It will follow the guidelines set forth above by CDPH effective March 1.

Covered employees in the <u>public or private sectors</u> who <u>work for employers with 26 or more employees</u> are entitled to up to 80 hours of 2022 COVID-19 related paid sick leave from January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022, immediately upon an oral or written request to their employer, with up to 40 of those hours available only when an employee or family member tests positive for COVID-19.

A full-time covered employee may take up to 40 hours of leave if the employee is unable to work or telework for any of the following reasons:

- Vaccine-Related: The covered employee is attending a vaccine or booster appointment for themselves or a family member\* or cannot work or telework because they have vaccine--related symptoms or are caring for a family member with vaccine-related symptoms. An employer may limit an employee to 24 hours or 3 days of leave for each vaccination or booster appointment and any consequent side effects, unless a health care provider verifies that more recovery time is needed.
- Caring for Yourself: The employee is subject to quarantine or isolation period related to COVID-19 as defined by an order or guidance of the California Department of Public Health, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or a local public health officer with jurisdiction over the workplace; has been advised by a healthcare provider to quarantine; or is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms and seeking a medical diagnosis.
- Caring for a Family Member\*: The covered employee is caring for a family member who is subject to a COVID-19 quarantine or isolation period or has been advised by a healthcare provider to quarantine due to COVID-19, or is caring for a child whose school or place of care is closed or unavailable due to COVID-19 on the premises.

A full-time covered employee may take up to an additional 40 hours of leave if the employee is unable to work or telework for either of the following reasons:

- o The covered employee tests positive for COVID-19
- The covered employee is caring for a family member\* who tested positive for COVID-19.
  - \* A family member includes a child, parent, spouse, registered domestic partner, grandparent, grandchild, or sibling.

Part-Time covered Employees: Part-time covered employees may take as leave up to the amount of hours they work over two weeks, with half of those hours available only when they or a family member\* test positive for COVID-19.

<u>Payment</u>: If an employee took leave for one of the reasons identified above between January 1, 2022 and February 19, 2022, and that leave was either unpaid or compensated at a rate less than the employee's regular rate of pay, the employee may also request a retroactive payment. Payment is at the employee's regular or usual rate of pay, not to exceed \$511 per day and \$5,110 in total.

Retaliation or discrimination against a covered employee requesting or using COVID-19 supplemental paid sick leave is strictly prohibited. A covered employee who experiences such retaliation or discrimination can file a claim with the Labor Commissioner's Office.
